CHRISTMAS TREE FESTIVAL 6th - 10th DECEMBER:

To the delight of many, the **Christmas Tree Festival** is happening in St John's this coming **December from 6th-10th inclusive**. The Christmas Tree Festival is being organised by the Dumfries Flower Club and St John's. It begins on Wednesday evening 6th December with the church in darkness except for the Christmas tree lights- a spectacular scene! The church will each evening be in darkness with only the Christmas tree lights on. However, during the day the detail, beauty and creativity of the trees can be admired more clearly. There will be approx. 70 trees, decorated by various groups in the community, and it will be a sight to behold! St John's will have ten trees, 8 of which will tell the Christmas story. The Christmas Tree Festival will close with our **Carol Service for Advent on Sunday 10th December at 6pm.**

The proceeds of this event, once expenses are deducted, will be divided between the Dumfries Flower Club and St John's. St John's and the Flower Club will retain 50 percent for their own funds and 50 percent will go to a charity. In the case of St John's, the charity chosen is Bethany Christian Trust.

The preparation for such an event, as you can imagine, is considerable and inevitably it will cause some disruption to various groups and services

during that week, as both the church and hall will be out of action from Monday 6th to allow set up and the opening of the Christmas Tree Festival itself. The Tuesday evening and Wednesday morning Services as well as the Mothers' Union Eucharistic Service will be held in the Rectory at the normal times. So please be patient with us with these changes for this exciting venture.

To help make this a successful event we need Volunteers on the Wednesday evening, all day Saturday and on the Sunday afternoon to help with 2 tasks:

Rotas are at the back of the church, do please help when you can. If you have any questions about what


will be involved, please ask Carolynne Sorrell about stewarding or Catriona Appleby Strivens & Margaret Morton about the refreshments and sales table.

- MU Global Day of Action each year MU globally has a 16 Days of Activism Campaign, focussing on the 1 in 3 women worldwide who experience domestic abuse. Did you know that 108 women were the victims of domestic homicide in the UK in 2022? This year, RISE UP Against Domestic Abuse has been launched by MU throughout Britain and Ireland, so the challenge is to be active 365 days a year against domestic abuse. The Global Day of Action is on Saturday 25th November, and St John's MU is holding a Vigil, to mark the 16 Days of Activism, in the Church from 9 am 5 pm, with a candle being lit after each 30- minute session, making 16 candles in all by the end of the Vigil, one for each day of Activism. The Congregation is warmly invited to attend for any 30 minute period. Resources for prayer and reflection will be provided and this will be a day of silence.
