These young men urgently need warm clothing, waterproofs and shoes - five of them only had flip flops when they arrived. If you or your friends have young male relatives with clothes / shoes they no longer want, please can you donate to MOOL. Shoe sizes 41 - 44 sought and most of the guys are slim! If you let her know, Lizanne can collect from St John's or from your home, or they can be taken straight to the depot in the basement at St Andrew's Church Hall any Friday morning. Everyone will be most grateful.

CHRISTIAN AID IN LENT:

• Last Call for Lunch! Thank you to everyone who has helped with, or supported, the Lent Lunches over the past weeks. The last lunch will be this coming Friday and we will be having another Bring & Buy Stall, so, if you meant to donate something but couldn't, there is a second chance.
