If you or your friends have young male relatives with clothes / shoes they no longer want, please can you donate to MOOL. Shoe sizes 41 - 44 sought and most of the guys are slim! If you let her know, Lizanne can collect from St John's or from your home, or they can be taken straight to the depot in the basement at St Andrew's Church Hall any Friday morning. Everyone will be most grateful.

#### **LENT LUNCHES:**

Thanks to everyone who supported these in any way. By the end of the fifth lunch, over £3,700 had been raised. This would fund 37 mobile health clinics to bring health services to remote areas in the Developing World. When the full total is known, we'll let you know. See you next year!
