


The next MU lunchtime


Thank you for your wonderful suggestions; we were spoilt for choice. We could not do them all but some of the outing ideas have

I am emailing from Lifeline, a specialist temporary fostering service to support survivors of domestic abuse. We temporarily care for survivors' cats whilst they flee to emergency temporary accommodation or refuge, with the view to return the cat to them once they are safely rehoused and back on their feet.

I'm reaching out to you because we have recently launched the service into Scotland for the first time, and I'd be greatly appreciative if you would be willing to share knowledge of our service amongst your practitioners. We're in need of volunteer foster carers, from all walks of life, to help us support survivors and their pets across Scotland. I also know that you will often support members of your community through hardship, and should the need ever arise for our service, I do hope you would be able and willing to pass along our contact information to any in need.

CHRISTIAN AID:

- Firstly, the Lent Lunches. It was great to see so many people at the lunches. Thank you to those who supported them week by week. We really appreciated the number of positive comments.
- The total raised after expenses was £4545.59 The money will be given to Christian Aid to use where the need is greatest but, as an example, the total would enable Christian Aid to buy and run 39 mobile health clinics.

- Today is the beginning of Christian Aid Week, which this year focuses on Burundi where malnourishment, disease and poverty affect more than 70% of the population, making survival a daily struggle. Jobs and food are hard to come by, and those who have homes often have no electricity or running water nor can they be sure that their home will survive the next storm.
- Please do look at the display at the back of church. It tells the story of Aline. Sadly her story is typical of many others. The victim of an abusive marriage she was homeless and with no means of supporting herself. Thankfully she attended a course run by a Christian Aid partner to teach her to manage money and with a small start-up loan, she started trading avocados and peanuts locally. With her profits, she bought a bicycle so she could transport greater quantities of goods to markets further afield and over time has been able to establish herself in her own home and reunite with the children she had to leave behind.
