
#### DATES FOR YOUR DIARY

#### CHRISTIAN AID

- Firstly,the Lent Lunches. It was great to see so many people at the lunches. Thank you to those who supported them week by week. We really appreciated the number of positive comments.
- The total raised after expenses was £4545.59 The money will be given to Christian Aid to use where the need is greatest but, as an example, the total would enable Christian Aid to buy and run 39 mobile health clinics.

## See you next year!

• Today marks the official end of Christian Aid Week (although donations will be gratefully received in the next few weeks) which this year has focused on Burundi where malnourishment, disease and poverty affect more than 70% of the population, making survival a daily struggle. Jobs and food are hard to come by, and those who have homes often have no electricity or running water nor can they be sure that their home will survive the next storm.

- Please do look at the display at the back of church. It tells the story of Aline. Sadly her story is typical of many others. The victim of an abusive marriage she was homeless and with no means of supporting herself. Thankfully she attended a course run by a Christian Aid partner to teach her to manage money and with a small start-up loan, she started trading avocados and peanuts locally. With her profits, she bought a bicycle so she could transport greater quantities of goods to markets further afield and over time has been able to establish herself in her own home and reunite with the children she had to leave behind.
