The obsolete, and non-working, corridor light outside the toilets has now been replaced, as have those in the kitchen area, in anticipation. They are more energy efficient, parts are readily available for them, and they also come on instantly. As you know, they're on PIRs (movement sensors), so will come on and, eventually, switch themselves off automatically.

SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING

Firstly, many thanks to everyone who stayed for the SGM and contributed to our discussions.

- The first item was listed as the future of the church. This considered the Vestry's review of our work with children and families and the proposal that the children and families worker be recruited. After a lively debate the meeting agreed with the proposal, noting that an appointment may be full or part time. The Vestry will work up the proposal and seek grant funding towards the cost of the post. There will be a further meeting in the autumn to report back on the progress made.
- The item to consider the future of the hall focused on the condition of the Hall roof. Although there are a number of ideas about how we use the Hall in future it was agreed the first priority has to be to replace the roof. It is estimated that this will cost in the order of £60,000 plus VAT. Again the Vestry will look at the possibility of obtaining grants towards the cost and to investigate the precise way the roof will be repaired or replaced. Stop Press: Further generous

donations, some enhanced by Gift Aid, have been received; we're now up to £2,250 most grateful.

• The financial position is not good, and Christopher explained the detail to us. Our gas and electricity bills will go up considerably in December when our fixed term contract comes to an end. Our gas bill alone last January was £2,000 and it will be considerably more this January. It is expected our quota to the Diocese and also stipend will increase in February and our general expenditure is gradually increasing due to rising costs. It was agreed that in addition to any fund raising events it is necessary for us all to dig deeper and consider our regular giving.
