



- There will be a Healing Eucharist at the end of the day to share together what we have been talking about.

We will be holding a **Safeguarding Study Day** on Saturday, 25/10/2025. This is, to all intents and purposes, a **requirement** (Diocesan, Provincial, Governmental) for people involved in much of the work we do; certainly for Trustees of the church (the Vestry), Clergy, and for those involved in work with children, vulnerable people, those occupying positions of trust etc. Emails have gone out to the 'main protagonists', asking people to commit to this. Ideally, everyone involved in any way in any of the activities described above should attend and certainly, as a minimum, each group should have at least one representative in attendance.
